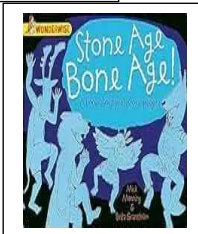
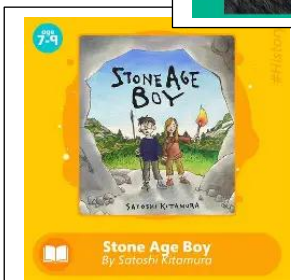
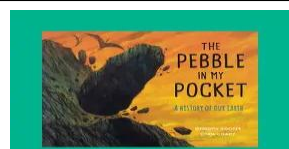


English.



In English this term we will be exploring the Stone Age. We will explore picture books and a fiction text. This will be our inspiration for writing a narrative and some poetry. Focus will be on shape, size and spacing of letters and words to develop and good presentation in all written work.



RE and World Views

Science



In Science this term we will be exploring materials. We will investigate the properties of materials, their uses and where they come from. We will do this through fair testing, making observations and recording data which we will then evaluate and draw conclusions from.

PE



This term we will continue to develop our personal skills and physical stamina. We will focus on our communication skills, to work as a team and develop resilience.

History



We will be exploring the Stone Age and what early humans were like. Then we will explore the different periods within the Stone Age: Mesolithic, Palaeolithic and Neolithic. What was life like during these periods? How were they the same or different?

Maths



In maths we will be revising knowledge of place value and developing our understanding. Year 2 will revise number fact knowledge up to 20 and then explore numbers up to 100. Year 3 will revise numbers up to 100 and develop number facts up to 1000. Then we will apply our knowledge to carry out accurate addition, subtraction. We will include problem solving and reasoning to deepen our understanding. We will develop our mental and written arithmetic skills and will practice daily number facts.

Computing



This term we will focus on digital publishing. We will revise and extend our knowledge of staying safe when using information technology. Then we will explore the different ways to communicate on and offline, such as text, images and emojis. We will design our own magazine front cover using desktop publishing software.

MFL



Mrs Hussey will be teaching French this term. We will be learning all about ourselves. We will revise writing and speaking simple vocabulary to support greetings and numbers to 10, then practise expanding phrases into sentences-questions and answers.

Geography



We will be exploring how volcanoes are formed, the movement of tectonic plates and where they can be found. We will be locating where volcanoes are in the world, using atlases and Google Earth.

Recognise everyday materials such as wood, metal, plastic, glass, brick, rock, paper and cardboard for which materials are suitable for particular purposes

To understand that shapes of solid objects made from some materials can be changed by squashing, bending, twisting and stretching

History-Stone Age

To explain the changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age, such as the Neolithic hunter-gatherers

Iron Age- a period where iron was a useful metal to make things

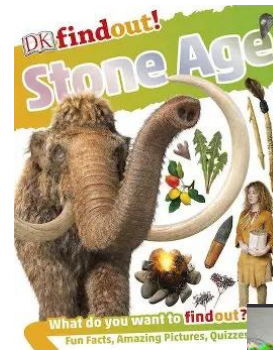
Bronze Age- a period where bronze was a new material to make everyday things

Ancient- very old (thousands of years old!)

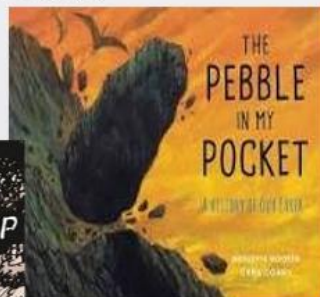
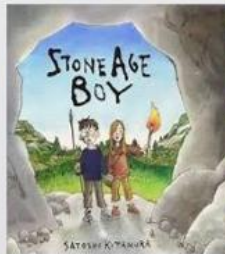
Archaeology- discovery of objects or physical remains(artefacts) that tell us about the past
