



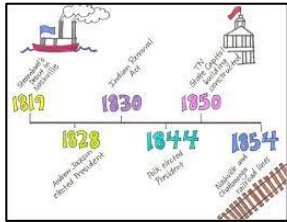

Science

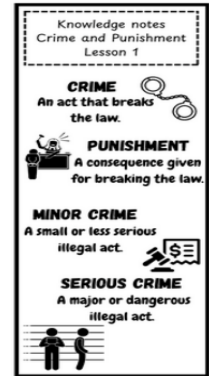

Remember a glossary is in alphabetical order and the best ones are illustrated to act as a visual reminder of the meaning of the word.



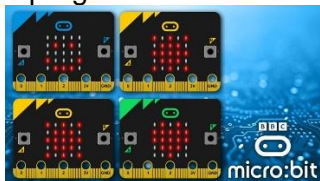
Computing
