## Free Taster Sessions at The Nest – Breakfast & After School Club


This term at The Nest, we are delighted to offer free taster sessions for children who would like to come along and give it a try.

## **Important Information from the Children's Commissioner of England**

Last week the Children's Commissioner of England published a new guide for parents and carers, developed with children and young people, [what I wish my parents or carers knew: A guide for parents on managing children's digital lives](#)

Supporting children's safety online is a shared responsibility for parents, professionals and wider society. For parents and carers, this responsibility has become increasingly complex as children's lives are now deeply intertwined with the digital world. Many parents face difficult decisions about how to balance protecting their children from online harm with enabling access to spaces that are now central to learning, socialising and play. The guide was directly influenced by children in England. It is a reflection of their views, and what they said that they wished their parents knew. We hope this guide will be a useful resource for parents and carers.
